India - Greece Bilateral Relations

A. Introduction

- 1. India's contacts with Greece began over 2500 years ago. India's traditionally long standing, warm and friendly relationship with Greece has been marked by consistent support to each other on issues of core national interest. Greece supports our quest for permanent seat in an expanded UNSC.
- 2. The number of Indian community is 11,333. Currently, they are estimated to be between 13000-14000. They have been living across various parts of Greece for many years and are predominantly from Punjab and largely Sikhs. Most Indians are farm, factory or construction workers.

B. Commercial Relations (Trade and Foreign Investment) – Recent facts & figures

3. As a trading country partner of India, and as per latest compiled and available statistics with DGCI&S, India's exports to Greece during April'23-January'24 have been recorded at 757.87 million US Dollar and India's imports from Greece during the same reference period stands at 762.90 million US Dollar. India's imports from Greece were significantly high in 2022-23.

- 4. The main Export items from India to Greece are Aluminum, organic chemicals; fish and crustaceans; iron and steel; plastic; textile articles; edible fruit and nuts; peel or citrus fruit; onions, sesame seeds, spices, coffee, tea, cashew nuts etc.
- 5. The main import items from Greece are Aluminium foil; mineral fuels, mineral oils and products of their distillation; sulphur; lime and cement; nuclear reactors, boilers etc.
- 6. The Indian infrastructure company, GMR Airports Ltd. and its joint venture partner, GEK-Terna, a leading Greek infrastructure company was awarded a contract, for a €850 million construction project of a new airport at Kasteli in Crete Island, marks the first-ever entry of an Indian company in Greece in recent years.
- 7. M/s. UPL Hellas, an Indian multinational company is also having its establishment in Greece. It deals in plant protection products, fertilizer, Biosilutions and agronomist in the country side and also farmers in Greece and neighbouring region.

C. Other Major Areas of Co-operation

- India and Greece have signed multiple Agreements/MoUs covering areas such as Sports, S&T, Defence, Air Services, Agriculture, New and Renewable Energy, Education, Agreements on Avoidance of Double Taxation, Outer Space, Geology and Mineral Resources, science & technology and Gainful Employment of Spouses & Eligible Dependents of Members of Diplomatic Missions and Mutual Legal Assistance Treaty (MLAT).
- Indian Air Force participated in the multinational air exercise INIOCHOS-23 hosted by the Hellenic Air Force at the Andravida Air Base in Greece from 24 April to 04 May, 2023. The IAF participated with four Su-30 MKI and two C-17 aircraft.INS Chennai naval ship of Indian Navy visited Souda Bay, Crete from 27-29July,2023 and undertook a Passage Exercise with the Hellenic Naval Ship Nikiforos Fokas in the Aegian Sea.
